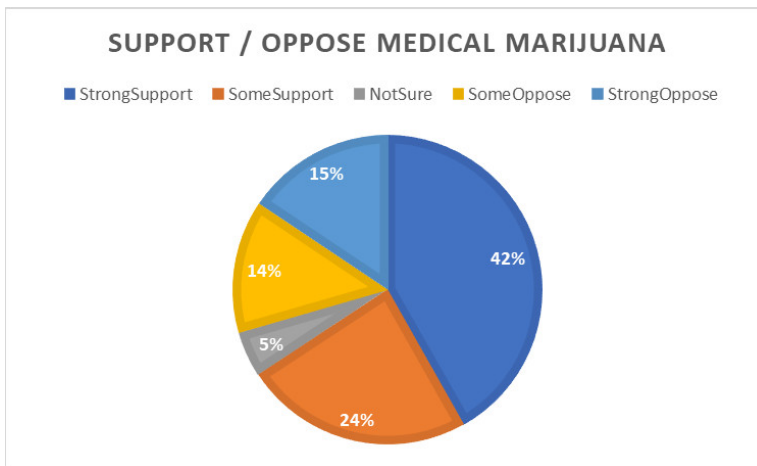


Solid Support for Medical Marijuana in Kansas

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TOPEKA—Sixty-six percent of Kansans indicate they support Medical Marijuana according to a new poll conducted by VCreek/AMG.



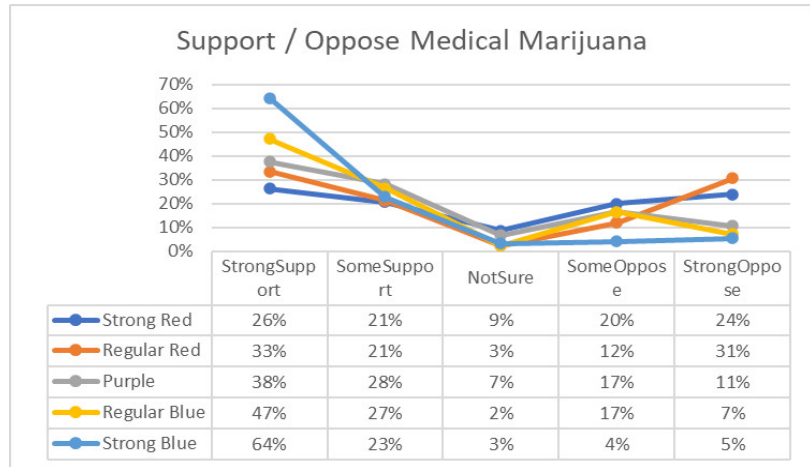
Forty-two percent indicate they strongly support Medical Marijuana while only 15% indicate strong opposition. These results are similar to what VCreek found when it polled the issue in Oklahoma in 2018.

“People think cannabis should be a legal option for treating a range of ailments,” Johannes said.

Support and opposition breakdown along partisan lines, but not very strongly. Nearly half of the strongest Republicans favor of Medical Marijuana compared to 87% of the strongest Democrats.

“Many of my Conservative Republican clients in Oklahoma were stunned by support for Medical Marijuana among strong Republicans,” Johannes said. “And some Kansans are likely to be surprised as well.”

“If Kansas was an initiative and referendum state, Medical Marijuana would be on a ballot and pass,” Johannes said.



Johannes thinks a key component of support is how Medical Marijuana would be controlled. The poll question asked-- “The Governor of Kansas recently proposed legislation that would legalize marijuana use for adults with a doctor’s prescription. The legislation is similar to laws

in Ohio and Missouri with strong regulations and license requirements for the medical marijuana industry. To what degree do you support or oppose legalizing marijuana use for adults with a doctor's prescription?"

The poll did not test the proposed tie-up of Medical Marijuana with expanding Medicaid.

“A major market segment of the industry is middle and upper middle class working adults. Some of the most popular cannabis products like edible gummies are formulated so the user does not get very high and are frequently used for pain relief, occasional sleep troubles and anxiety,” Johannes said. “Kansans know these products exist and think they should be available for use in Kansas.”

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METHODOLOGY: N=507 Via IVR conducted February 5, 2021. Responses joined back to database of voters and stratified and weighted by voter model score based on correlations of consumer behavior. CI 4.35
